OUR TOPICS

This month we will continue to learn about books. We will become authors and illustrators by making books, talking about books, retelling stories and discussing what books we like. We I will be looking at all kinds of different books like I fact books, encyclopaedias, dictionaries, story books, collections of poems and talking about the similarities and differences between them. We will be learning about being a good friend and the importance of being kind as we enter the period of Lent. We will also be learning about Space, and we will have a Space Station set up in the classroom. We will be asking 'Is there really life out there?' as we paint aliens for the wall. We will also begin to look at Spring, a topic which will carry forward into April.

OBSERVATIONS
