Our Topics

This month we will be looking at the topics Autumn and Halloween. We will go on an Autumn walk, looking at the changes in the trees, drawing hedgehogs and squirrels, printing with apples and producing pictures of Autumn trees. The children will also have great fun making spells in the water tray with spiders, bats, worms and snakes. We are continuing to focus on promoting independence; we will be encouraging each child to 'have a go' at taking off and putting on his/her own shoes, coats, dressing up clothes etc. Encouraging each child to make appropriate choices during the classroom day plays a large part in your child growing in self-confidence and self-esteem as he/she learns to do new things. We would ask for your support in this - encourage them to be as independent as possible at home.

We will also be

- checking to see who already knows the names of various colours
- seeing who can talk about various signs of autumn
- watching to see who is using imagination as they play with the Halloween props.

This month you can have lots of fun getting ready for Halloween. It is hard to beat the classics like dunking for apples and tying apples to a string from the door frame...not only are these fun but they really help your child's physical development!

Extend your child's imagination with some messy play. Make a potion in the sink (or the bath if you're brave!) Add your 'ingredients'...maybe some chopped cooked spaghetti, some drops of food colouring and some bubbles and let them cook up a storm!

Make a costume...promote creativity by helping your child to create their own costume with things you can find in the house. Don't underestimate the trusty white sheet to make a good ghost!

Go on an Autumn scavenger hunt. You can pick up a page from the Nursery notice board if you like and see how many of the signs of Autumn you can find. Speak to your child about the changes in the weather, the length of day, the colours of the trees.
