OUR TOPICS

Welcome back! We hope you all had a lovely Christmas and want to take this opportunity to wish you all a Happy New Year. As we enter the second busy term of the school year, we would like to thank you for all your support during term 1 and hope we can continue to build strong parent school links this term through day to day interactions and our Getting Ready to Learn programme.

This month we will been looking at the topic people who help us. We will talk about fire-fighters,
doctors, nurses, police officers and other jobs that people do. We have our own hospital in the role
play area and the children will be dressing up and acting out the roles of doctors, nurses, surgeons and
ambulance drivers. We will have all sorts of things to support the children in their play including
syringes, bandages and some slings. We will put syringes and medicine bottles in the water, we will
complete hospital jigsaws and develop our language in the small world hospital.

BRIGHT IDEAS!

Would your child know what to do in an emergency?

Talk to your child about dialling 999 in an emergency, emphasising the importance of only calling it in a real emergency. Talk them through what might be said on the phone to them, or better still, why not act it out? Do they know their home address? If not, help them to learn it.

Take a visit to the local library. Ask your child to find books which are about people who help us. Some will be fact books and some will be fiction- are they able to sort them?

Talk to your child about your job...you may be amazed at what they think you do all day while they are at school! Why not talk to them about the job they would like to do when they are older.

Sing songs and say rhymes about people who help us with your child. What about 'Five Little Monkeys' or 'Miss Polly had a Dolly'?

OBSERVATIONS

This month we will be checking:

Can children understand and use positional language up, down, in front, behind, under, beside.

Can the children count up to 5 using 1 to 1 correspondence?

Can they talk about the jobs people do?

Can children the use books appropriately / enjoy looking at books in the classroom?
